CHANGES FOR GROWTH

Since its creation July 2006 in Granada, Spain, SCIA (now SCWNet) has grown to 95 organization members and 160 individuals. Many proposals for revisions were discussed at the January 2009 Solar Food Conference in Indore, India, and plans for the next 3 years were drafted.

Its purpose is unchanged, but name and structure are changed toward further growth. "Network" better describes its nature and "world" helps avoid confusion with individual organizations. This network focuses on collective strength beyond the vast information already available on many web sites and SCI's Solar Cooker Review. Rather than Task Forces for small groups, we propose six Sections for all members to follow and contribute to as they choose. We think these wiki pages may be more user friendly for many participants than the discussion forums at. solarcooking.org/discuss, which require log-in and password. You can help us decide which is more useful. The Network Steering Committee is changed from 17 individuals to 9 lead agencies which appoint representatives to serve for 2009 and 2010, Founding President, David Whitfield, will also serve.

DO WE NEED EACH OTHER?

As an enjoyer and promoter of solar cookers for 23 years, I've gained most of my wisdom and inspiration from courageous, delightful people who are spreading access to many different simple solar tools.

While promoting different devices and strategies, common challenges unite us. Networking has often shown ways past barriers and re-energized me. PURPOSE OF SCWNet
